"Laurel Shear: Daydreaming in My Nightmare" at Fort Gansevoort Gallery

Shear's large-scale abstract paintings—built to the size of a California king-size bed to be exact—are at once arresting and vibrant. Details of folds in bedsheets and other tactile materials are a recurring source of imagery in her work are reworked with often moody palettes into elaborate dreamscapes. Following an enthusiastic reception at the recent Untitled fair in San Francisco, Fort Gansevoort gallery director Adam Shopkorn brought the Bay Area artist's work east for a debut show at the gallery where sales have been robust.
