Fort Gansevoort Now Represents the Estate of Winfred Rembert

Following his death last year at the age of 75, New York's **Fort Gansevoort** gallery will represent the estate of **Winfred Rembert**, an artist whose work reflected on racism and prejudice in the Jim Crow South. Rembert survived a near-lynching, and he spent seven years in prison, at one point briefly escaping. His art, filled with incarcerated figures arranged in striking patterns, often borders on abstraction. Later this year, Rembert's memoir will be published.
